Penrhyn Grove Betrayal

The council has approved for the demolition of 52 garages off Penrhyn Grove, and their replacement with 10 new houses. At a crowded planning meeting, Labour councillors voted in favour of the plan despite objections from both residents and Lib Dems.

Our recent survey of residents in the **Brettenham Road** area has helped highlight concerns over the plan. Only 16% of local residents surveyed wanted the site developed as planned, and many have formed a campaign against the proposal.

Daniel Lockwood, one of the key coordinators, said, "We have come incredibly far without the support of our elected Labour Councillors. It is obvious that the Labour councillors are not listening to the concerns of local people."



Focus Team member **Sean Meiszner** said, "We do need more affordable family housing in the area, but this development crowbars too many houses onto a small site and removing 52 garages when parking is one of the top problem issues locally is not sensible."


